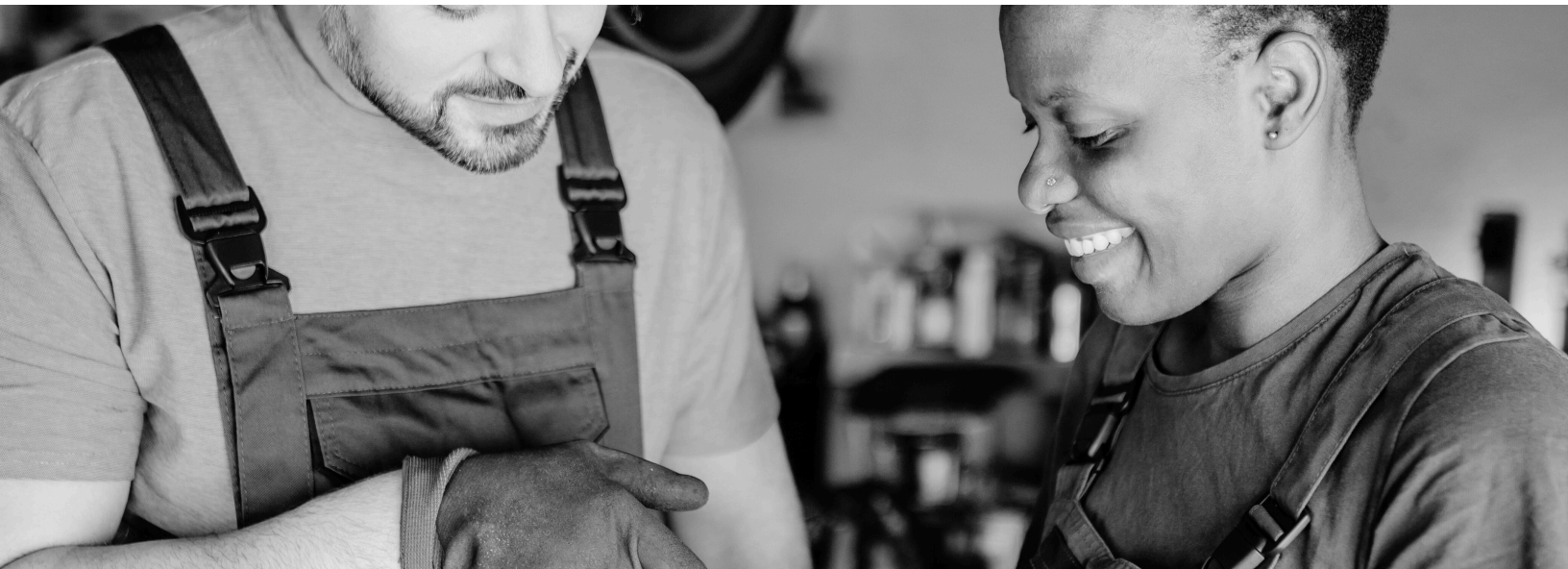

WHERE **PROFIT** **LEAKS** IN AUTO REPAIR SHOPS
